Montana's Ultimate Outdoorsy Town Has a New, Hip Hotel

Bozeman, Montana, a city that consistently ranks as one of *Outside's* best towns, has added a noteworthy new lodging option in the heart of downtown. The previously un-remarkable 1960s Imperial Inn hotel, has been completely transformed by local architectural firm *Thinktank Design Group* into The LARK, maintaining its **streamline-era architecture** but with major facelifts. Now there's a new, hip lodging option in a major outdoor hub located only **16-miles from Bridger Bowl Ski Area**, an hour north of *Big Sky Resort* and the private Yellowstone Club, and at the gateway to Yellowstone National Park.

The LARK features **38 rooms** that are *uniquely Bozeman*, decorated with works by local artists and craftsmen. The Map Room sits near the lobby and provides an artistic offering for finding your way around locally. The new open-air design, outdoor fire pit, and wider balconies take advantage of the **main street location** in Bozeman's bustling downtown. Restaurants, breweries and the arts and cultural center are all within walking distance.
