A separate building with 28 rooms will be constructed on the corner of Main Street and Grand Avenue. The new building will sit adjacent to Victory Taco. That space is currently used for hotel parking. Plans are to valet future visitors to the downtown parking structure.

The hotel's owners are hoping to bank on their success and provide more availability for visitors that want to stay in the downtown area.

"Tourism is a major part of the economy around here so providing an opportunity for more people to enjoy and take part in downtown and what Bozeman has to offer is only adding value to the community," said Brian Caldwell, an architect at ThinkTank and co-owner of The Lark Hotel.

Caldwell said he's always had the intention of expanding The Lark. He added that he's looking at other locations for future expansion.
