The Bozeman, Montana Cuisine Scene

HOVERING AT AROUND 40,000 RESIDENTS, Bozeman is a good-sized Montana town with a culinary scene that's what you'd hope for in Big Sky Country—namely, heaping helpings and top-tier beef. But there are also plenty of pleasant surprises when Bozeman chefs ring the dinner bell. Here are some of our favorite spots that represent what's great about eating in Bozeman.

Jam

Offering innovative takes on traditional brunch items, Jam has something for everybody. But not in the “We have a million menu items, one of them should do it for you” kind of way. More in the, “If you like a good benedict, try our Chicken & Biscuit version” or the “You're a fan of corned beef hash? Try ours, with red chili” kind of way. Nova Café

A true cornerstone of the community as well as the restaurant scene, the Nova has been the premier stop on Bozeman's breakfast circuit for some time now and is still firing on all cylinders. They source from and support local farms and businesses as much as possible, and it translates to the plate. Try an omelet made with locally sourced mushrooms or house-made chorizo, and you'll become an instant convert. thenovacafe.com

Burger Bob's

Equal parts good humor and good food, Burger Bob's is known for the neon window sign that announces “Sorry, we're open.” They're also known for their burgers—fresh Montana ground sirloin cooked to perfection. You can get it with all the standard and non-standard accoutrements, but it's that ½-pound patty that ties the room together. Also, get a milkshake. Plonk Wine Bar

Before or for dinner, stop at Bozeman's premier wine bar for drinks and small plates. With plenty of wine-by-the-glass options, craft cocktails, delectable tapas choices and even exceptional entree offerings, you can just as easily kick things off here or settle in for the evening. Victory Taco

Situated on the grounds of Bozeman's best new basecamp, the LARK hotel, Victory Taco is guaranteed a certain degree of summer evening-fueled success. But they are not resting on those location laurels in the slightest. Fresh-made guacamole,

Open Range

What might typify the perfect dinner out, Montana-style? An upscale but comfortable and welcoming atmosphere. Authentically sincere and attentive service.
